Robotics workshop was held on 29th of April 2023. It included two workshops as follows:

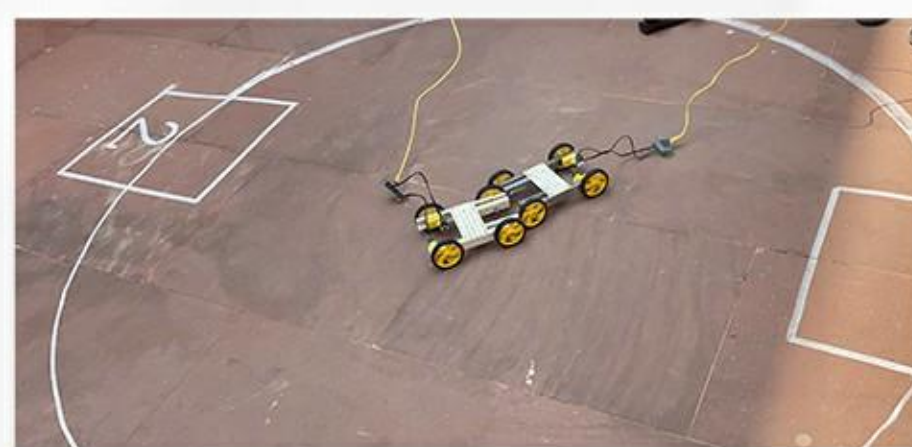
